<b>Matthew 20:29-34</b>	<b>Mark 10:46-52</b>	<b>Luke 18:35-43</b>
<p>(29) As they went out from Jericho, a great multitude followed him.</p> <p>(30) Behold, two blind men sitting by the road, when they heard that Jesus was passing by, cried out, "Lord, have mercy on us, you son of David!"</p> <p>(31) The multitude rebuked them, telling them that they should be quiet, but they cried out even more, "Lord, have mercy on us, you son of David!"</p> <p>(32) Jesus stood still, and called them, and asked, "What do you want me to do for you?"</p> <p>(33) They told him, "Lord, that our eyes may be opened."</p> <p>(34) Jesus, being moved with compassion, touched their eyes; and immediately their eyes received their sight, and they followed him.</p>	<p>(46) They came to Jericho. As he went out from Jericho, with his disciples and a great multitude, the son of Timaeus, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the road.</p> <p>(47) When he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out, and say, "Jesus, you son of David, have mercy on me!"</p> <p>(48) Many rebuked him, that he should be quiet, but he cried out much more, "You son of David, have mercy on me!"</p> <p>(49) Jesus stood still, and said, "Call him."</p> <p>They called the blind man, saying to him, "Cheer up! Get up. He is calling you!"</p> <p>(50) He, casting away his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus.</p> <p>(51) Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?"</p> <p>The blind man said to him, "Rabboni, that I may see again."</p> <p>(52) Jesus said to him, "Go your way. Your faith has made you well." Immediately he received his sight, and followed Jesus in the way.</p>	<p>(35) It happened, as he came near Jericho, a certain blind man sat by the road, begging.</p> <p>(36) Hearing a multitude going by, he asked what this meant.</p> <p>(37) They told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by.</p> <p>(38) He cried out, "Jesus, you son of David, have mercy on me!"</p> <p>(39) Those who led the way rebuked him, that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "You son of David, have mercy on me!"</p> <p>(40) Standing still, Jesus commanded him to be brought to him. When he had come near, he asked him,</p> <p>(41) "What do you want me to do?"</p> <p>He said, "Lord, that I may see again."</p> <p>(42) Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight. Your faith has healed you."</p> <p>(43) Immediately he received his sight, and followed him, glorifying God. All the people, when they saw it, praised God.</p>

Zaccheus is converted near Jericho

<b>Luke 19:1-10</b>
<p>(1) He entered and was passing through Jericho.</p> <p>(2) There was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector, and he was rich.</p> <p>(3) He was trying to see who Jesus was, and couldn't because of the crowd, because he was short.</p> <p>(4) He ran on ahead, and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was to pass that way.</p> <p>(5) When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and saw him, and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house."</p> <p>(6) He hurried, came down, and received him joyfully.</p> <p>(7) When they saw it, they all murmured, saying, "He has gone in to lodge with a man who is a sinner."</p> <p>(8) Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, half of my goods I give to the poor. If I have wrongfully exacted anything of anyone, I restore four times as much."</p> <p>(9) Jesus said to him, "Today, salvation has come to this house, because he also is a son of Abraham.</p> <p>(10) For the Son of Man came to seek and to save that which was lost."</p>
